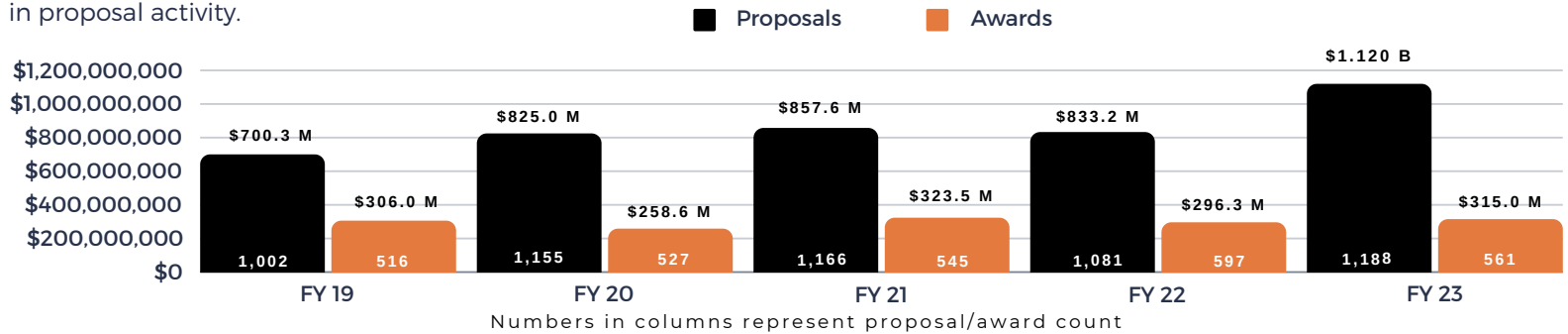


# ORPA BY THE NUMBERS

FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING 2023

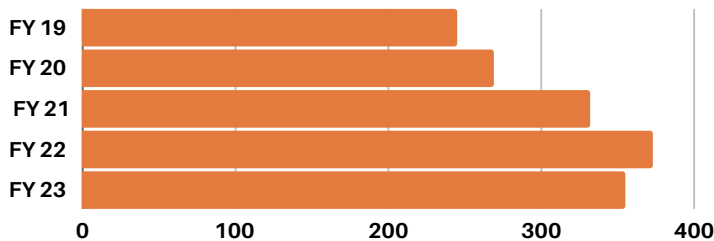
## PROPOSALS SUBMITTED AND AWARDED

The dollar value of proposals submitted through Princeton's Office of Research and Project Administration (ORPA) to sponsors dramatically grew in FY23: the University submitted proposals totaling over \$1 billion for the first time ever. The number of awards received has grown by about 10% over a five year period, and the dollar value of awards received has remained relatively steady. Award counts and dollar values are expected to increase in future years commensurate with the below-noted increases in proposal activity.



## SUBAWARDS\*

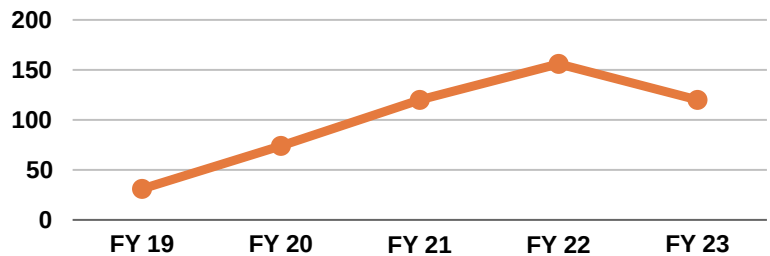
Subcontracts, agreements representing scientific collaboration with other research organizations around the US and the world, grew from 245 in FY19 to 355 in FY23, a growth of 45%.

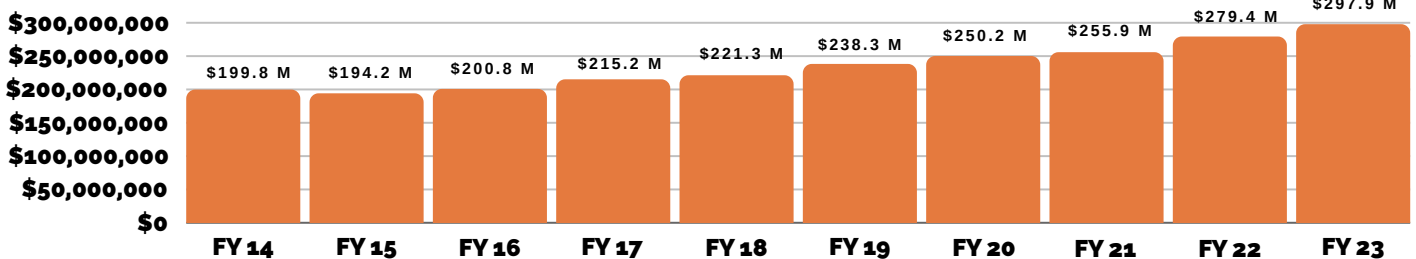
## NONFUNDED AGREEMENTS\*

Nonfunded agreements, such as data use agreements, confidentiality agreements, and other research-related agreements, representing unique and valuable connectivity and collaborations with organizations worldwide, grew from 31 in FY19 to 120 in FY23, a growth of 287%.
