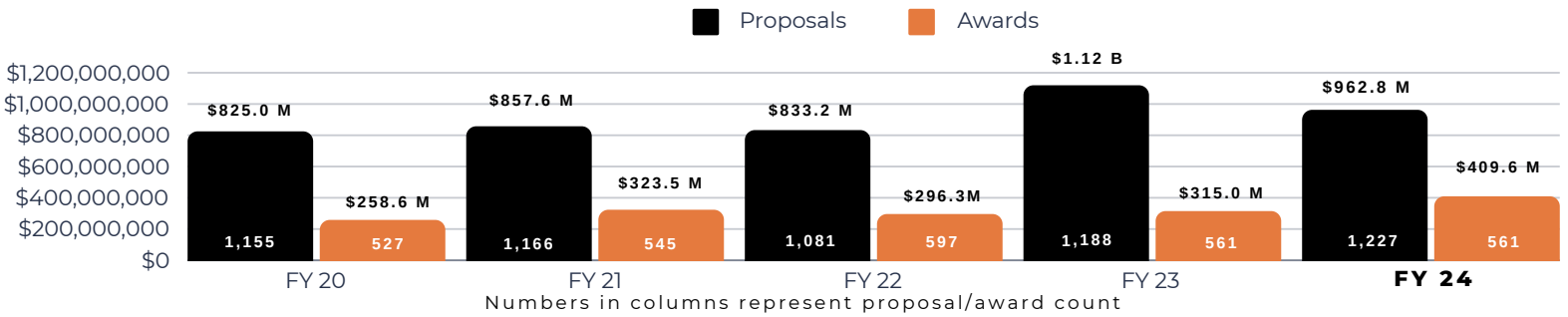


ORPA BY THE NUMBERS

FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING 2024

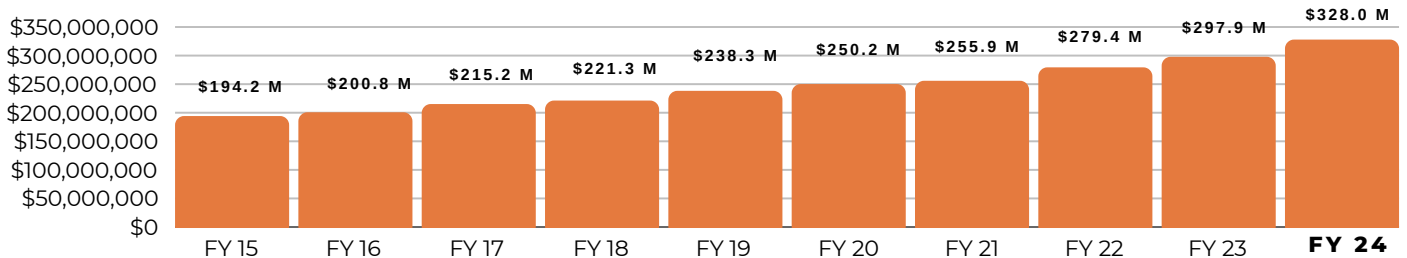
PROPOSALS SUBMITTED AND AWARDED

The dollar value of sponsored program awards through Princeton's Office of Research and Project Administration (ORPA) dramatically grew in FY24. The University was awarded over \$400 million for the first time ever. Additionally, the dollar value of proposals was for the second year in a row in the range of \$1 billion.



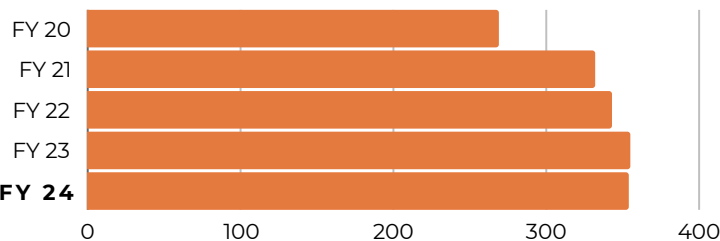
SPONSORED PROGRAM EXPENDITURES

Sponsored program expenditures have grown 69% over the last ten years at Princeton University, and 31% over the last five years.



SUBAWARDS ISSUED*

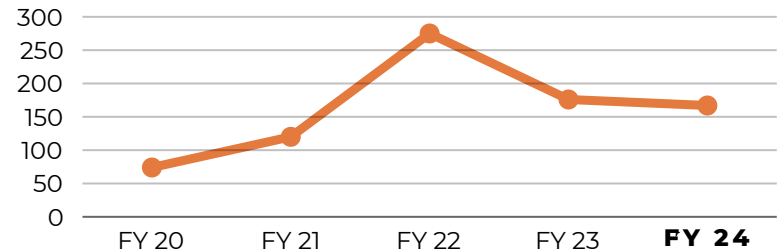
Subcontracts, agreements representing scientific collaboration with other research organizations around the US and the world under sponsored programs, grew from 269 in FY20 to 354 in FY24, a growth of 31%.

NONFUNDED AGREEMENTS*

Nonfunded agreements, such as data use agreements, confidentiality agreements, and other research-related agreements, representing unique and valuable connectivity and collaborations with organizations worldwide, grew from 74 in FY20 to 167 in FY24, a growth of 127%.

ORPA BY THE NUMBERS

FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING 2024

The Office of Research and Project Administration (ORPA) oversees a broad range of activities and programs that support the University's research enterprise. These include:

- A shared services program that provides subscription-based and backfill unit-level lifecycle research administration support to departments and centers at Princeton
- A research security program that guides researchers and administrators across the University in protecting and safeguarding its worldwide research activities
- A research administration training program that informally and formally educates research administrators at the University, growing its pipeline of talent in sponsored programs management and strengthening the knowledge base of research administrators at Princeton

Below are selected metrics representing the scope and accomplishments of these programs in FY24.

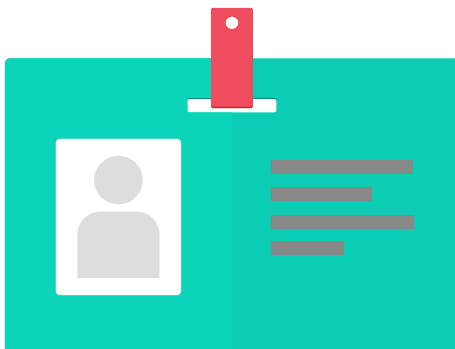
Grants Support Services

- Provided "lifecycle" sponsored programs administration to over 30 subscribing departments in Divisions I and II
- Developed and submitted 100 proposals to 62 number of sponsors
- Helped manage 35 new awards to 27 sponsors
- Provided temporary/backfill grants management support services to eight academic units in Divisions III and IV

Research Security

- Managed 19 active export licenses
- Reviewed 1253 shipments to 65 countries
- Convened and led the Research Security Coordination Committee (RSCC), a committee of senior administrators from across over 20 units/offices, which assists the University in complying with new and emerging federal research security standards and requirements

ARC Training Program

- A pilot and two cohorts since program inception in 2022
- 56 accepted program participants
- 20% increase in enrollment from Cohort 1 to Cohort 2
- 24 different academic unit participation, 31 job titles from all four divisions + central administration
