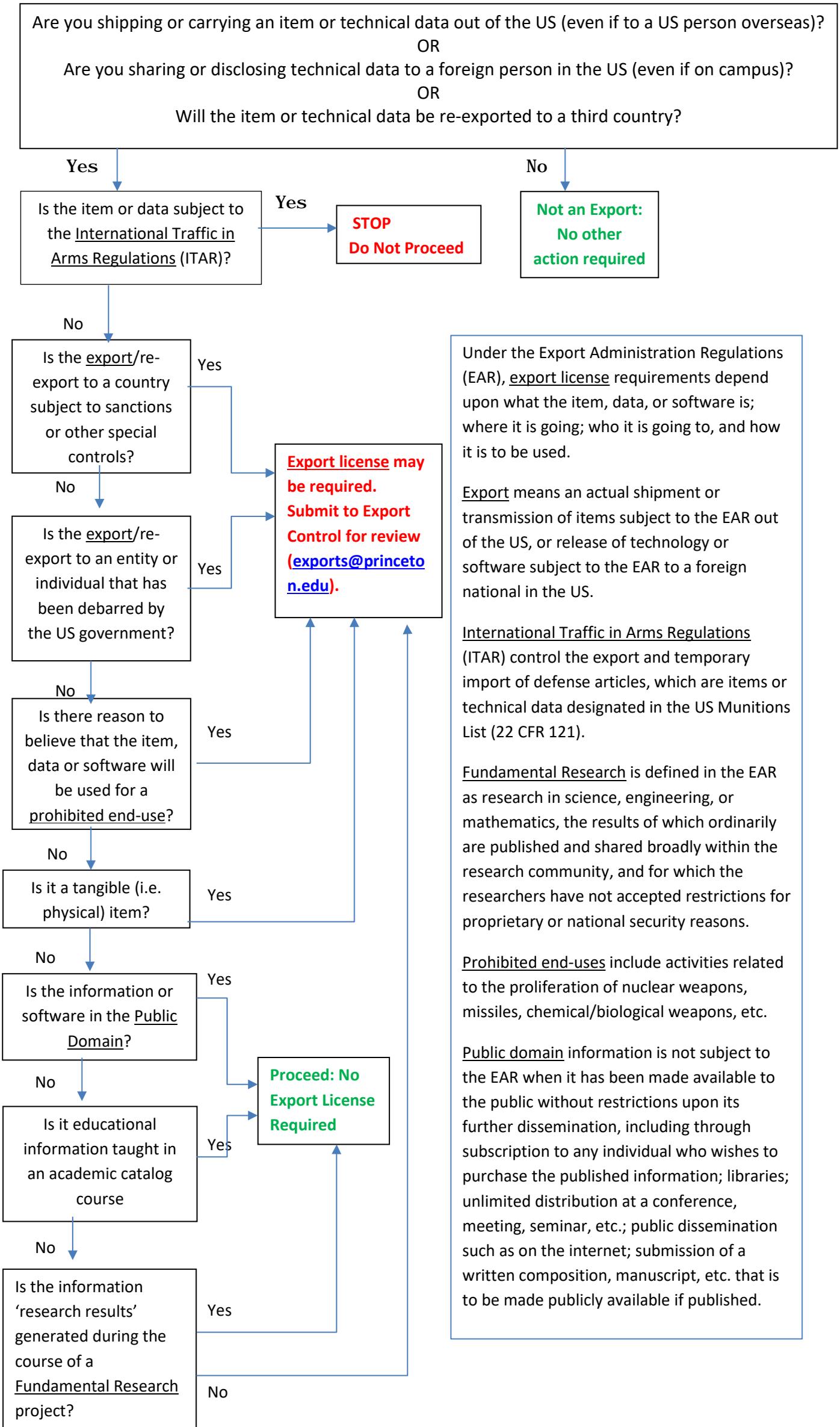


Export Control Compliance Flowchart



Under the Export Administration Regulations (EAR), export license requirements depend upon what the item, data, or software is; where it is going; who it is going to, and how it is to be used.

Export means an actual shipment or transmission of items subject to the EAR out of the US, or release of technology or software subject to the EAR to a foreign national in the US.

International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR) control the export and temporary import of defense articles, which are items or technical data designated in the US Munitions List (22 CFR 121).

Fundamental Research is defined in the EAR as research in science, engineering, or mathematics, the results of which ordinarily are published and shared broadly within the research community, and for which the researchers have not accepted restrictions for proprietary or national security reasons.

Prohibited end-uses include activities related to the proliferation of nuclear weapons, missiles, chemical/biological weapons, etc.

Public domain information is not subject to the EAR when it has been made available to the public without restrictions upon its further dissemination, including through subscription to any individual who wishes to purchase the published information; libraries; unlimited distribution at a conference, meeting, seminar, etc.; public dissemination such as on the internet; submission of a written composition, manuscript, etc. that is to be made publicly available if published.
